Henry Stagg Memorial Mustad Hook Trophy

Where: Within the club usual fishing boundaries Date: Friday 13 – Sunday 15 May 2022

Registrations: Sheets for registration will be at the clubrooms as of Friday 13 May.

The Henry Stagg Memorial Mustad Hook Trophy is for the heaviest fish of any Species (excluding sharks or rays) caught on a Mustad Hook.

50 Hooks will be supplied by the Club for this event.

A separate weigh sheet will be on the table at registration, so enter your name and in brackets under your name put the number of mustard hooks you have taken.

ALL FISH MUST HAVE THE HOOK STILL ATTACHED TO THE FISH WHEN WEIGHING IN.

The Weighmaster will oversee the running of this event. His word is final.

All fish must be gutted and gilled to weigh in. If the fish swallows the hook, you will still have to gut and gill it but leave the hook inside the fish.
